#### STATEMENT OF CONCERN

I am excited about the opportunity to serve on the board of Amigos Library Services. I have been familiar with Amigos most of my career and at times have interacted with that work. Former Amigos director Bonnie Juergens was an early mentor and colleague for much of my career and I have known and admired Miguel's visionary work since his days at ALA. While I was director at the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC), we used various Amigos services, including the courier as a backbone for statewide resource sharing. But among our areas of cooperation, I was most proud of our partnership with Amigos to establish the E-Read Texas e-book project using the SimplyE application for small public libraries across the state. Christine Peterson and I worked together with other members of the TSLAC staff to refine that project and I regard the launch of E-Read Texas as one of my greatest successes at TSLAC. Though TSLAC has since moved to a different application for E-Read Texas, Amigos was key to the early success of that project and I know Amigos continues to provide valuable support for libraries using the SimplyE app as their e-book solution.

I have always believed that successful library service depends upon access to up-to-date technology solutions, innovative and effective resource-sharing, and authoritative training and technical guidance. Amigos has long been a key component in all three of these critical support areas and I look forward to actively participating in efforts by Amigos to use these strategies to advance library services. I am concerned that small and rural libraries are not left behind as they actively work to fulfill their role as educational, economic, and cultural anchors in their communities. I worked hard at the state library to bring broadband services to rural libraries and that work has continued since I left. Thanks to the efforts of many in the library community, including Amigos, local libraries are seen as key players in delivering networked information throughout the state. I believe Amigos can be part of a broad-based effort to build the capacity of all libraries to deliver authoritative information to local communities. Libraries now face a variety of significant challenges and I would like to help Amigos grow its longstanding role as a solution to meeting those challenges.
