STATEMENT OF CONCERN

As the leader of successful libraries, I use continual assessment to design services and build resources that enhance teaching, learning, and research while improving usability and reducing barriers to access. I have substantive experience developing and refining strategic plans in the libraries which I have led. My overarching vision for academic libraries is tied to the model established by the Orbis Cascade Alliance, a model which I helped to develop, and which I've taken to heart personally and on behalf of my institution and those with whom I work: (1) maximize impact by doing things once, doing things the same, and doing things together; (2) invest in staff training, development, and expertise; and (3) leverage financial resources.

For me, the library as the true heart of an academic institution is far from a cliché or mere turn of phrase. An excellent, not just good, library is critical for the success of the entire institution. Student success is an underlying benchmark by which I measure my library's impact. The role of academic libraries under the broad umbrella of "scholarly communication" is an ever-growing and important one – also uniquely aligned with librarians' historical role as curators of knowledge, now with a twist that involves technology-enhanced storage, retrieval, and dissemination.

The resources available to accomplish all that we should for our various library constituencies are limited and continue to become more scarce. Working with other libraries and within consortial library organizations has been another hallmark of my leadership pathway in librarianship. I look forward putting this knowledge to work helping Amigos fulfil its mission of supporting libraries through the sharing of collections, services, and opportunities.

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
